Focus On Autism

In 2012, the Wisconsin - Upper Michigan District of Kiwanis began their autism project, Focus on Autism. The purpose of this project is to raise funds to provide iPads and the technology available with them to children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). These electronic devices help children with ASD improve their ability to communicate.

Focus on Autism started with a goal of raising \$500,000 and giving 1,000 iPads to children with autism. They have already raised over \$360,000 and distributed more than 880 iPads.

To date, area Kiwanis Clubs have been able to gift 80 iPads to children with ASD in Sheboygan County; and many more applicants still await their opportunity.
