Terms to Know:

Universal Screener: Valid and reliable data collection tools and processes used to assess students' current level of performance in relation to grade level benchmarks.

Intervention: Additional instruction for a student in an area of learning or behavior with a goal toward improved performance.

Strategies: Practices delivered in a variety of ways to meet the individual needs of all students.

Differentiation: Creating multiple paths so that students of different abilities, interests or learning styles, experience equally appropriate ways to use and apply leaning.

Progress Monitoring: A scientifically based practice used to assess students' academic or behavioral progress and evaluate the effectiveness of instruction.

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Response to Intervention (RTI)





What is RTI?

Response to Intervention (RtI) is a process that provides intervention and educational support to all students at increasing levels of intensity based on their individual needs. The goal is to prevent problems and intervene early so that students can be successful.

The RTI process has three tiers, each building upon one another and providing successively more intensive levels of support.

What Does Rtl Look Like at Sheboygan Falls Middle School?

During **FALCON TIME**, all core, related studies, and specialist teachers develop and facilitate <u>specific</u> lessons and activities, based on individual student data, toward the goal of meeting each student's needs and interests. - All members of the school community must continue to gain knowledge and develop expertise in order to build capacity and sustainability.
- Effective leadership at all levels is crucial for the implementation of RTI.
